

Bible Reading for the Week of August 10, 2025

Monday, August 11 – Ephesians 1:1-14

Considering verse 13 and 14 of this section, how does Paul emphasize the role of the Spirit here? How does the Spirit's role relate to the work of the Father and the Son in this section (vs. 3-14)? How might you give thanks today, specifically for the work of the Spirit in your life?

Tuesday, August 12 – Romans 8:1-11

How is the Spirit integrally involved in the life of the people of God, according to verses 5 through 8? What are some of the implications that Paul speaks of in verses 10 and 11 in light of the fact that *"the Spirit of God dwells in you"* (vs. 9)?

Wednesday, August 13 – John 14:15-31

How does Jesus describe the Spirit, and what does he say the Spirit will do when he comes? How does this teaching ministry of the Spirit relate to the people of God today? Spend time throughout the day pleading with the Spirit to give you a greater understanding of the things of God.

Thursday, August 14 – Hebrews 13:1-7

In verse 7, the author urges his listeners to *"Remember [their] leaders."* Who might be referring to in these verses? How might you and I remember and honor the leaders that God has placed over us? Thank the Lord today for granting to you the blessing of having leaders who care about your soul.

Friday, August 15 – Hebrews 13:8-18

In verses 17-19, the author returns again to the concept of the leaders of the church. What might these verses say to those who don't believe it is necessary to be a member of the local church? Consider this morning how you might specifically pray for those church leaders that God has placed over you.

Saturday, August 16 – Ephesians 4:1-16

In considering verses 8-16, what is the gift that Christ gave to the church after his ascension, according to the apostle Paul? How do *"the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers"* help the church to *"attain...to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ"* (vs. 11, 13)? Pray that the Lord would not only bless the one who preaches tomorrow, but also that He would bless the Word to the hearts and lives of those who hear.
