

Bible Reading for Week of May 11, 2025

Monday, May 12 – Isaiah 61: 1-4 and Luke 4: 16-21.

How does Jesus fulfill the words of Isaiah 61? What significance may there be in Jesus only quoting the beginning of Isaiah 61:2? Praise the Lord that Christ has come to set you free from your sin and misery.

Tuesday, May 13 – Luke 4: 16-29

Why do those in Jesus's own hometown reject him? How does this passage demonstrate the sovereignty of God over those who receive the ministry of Christ and those who do not? Take time today to thank God that He has revealed Himself savingly to you.

Wednesday, May 14– Luke 4: 31-37

How does this section connect with Jesus's comments in the synagogue at Nazareth just a few verses prior? In what ways does this miracle demonstrate the mercy and power of Jesus? Consider how this passage might fuel your service to the Lord this week.

Thursday, May 15 – Psalm 98: 1-9

Why do God's people sing praises to Him? What "marvelous things" would be on the minds of the Old Testament saints as they lifted their voices to this psalm? What "marvelous things" has the Lord accomplished for His people in the New Testament? Take time to give thanks to the Lord for His salvation of us.

Friday, May 16 – Psalm 99: 1-9

What should the response be for the people of God in light of the rule and reign of God? How might this concept translate to the New Testament church given that Jesus Christ now sits on the throne of God? Praise the Lord that He is exalted over all the nations.

Saturday, May 17 – Psalm 100: 1-5

What are the characteristics of those who come into the presence of God? What does this particular psalm tell us about God that should evoke praise and worship? Take time to ask the Lord that He would prepare you to worship Him tomorrow.
