

Bible Reading for the Week of November 9, 2025

Monday, November 10 – Ephesians 4:25-32

In light of the redemption that has been received through Christ, how does Paul address the use of the mouth in the life of the believer (see vs. 25 and 29)? Take time today to meditate on specific ways in which you can use your speech to build up, then pray and ask that the Holy Spirit would enable you to carry this out.

Tuesday, November 11 – Ephesians 4:25-32

What does the apostle Paul have to say concerning the heart of the believer (see vss. 26-27)? Why does Paul call believers to not let their anger linger through the night? How might the devil get a foothold in the life of the Christian who remains in anger and bitterness? Take time today to confess to the Lord any feelings of resentment or anger, either towards Him or His people.

Wednesday, November 12 – Ephesians 4:25-32

How should the Christian use his hands to serve the Lord (see vs. 28)? How might this command connect to the original mandate given to Adam in Genesis 1? Pray that God would enable you to serve Him well wherever He has called you

Thursday, November 13 – Psalm 46:1-11

Verses 1-3 describe events of crisis and upheaval. Why can the psalmist still rest secure in those types of scenarios? How might these events connect to your own life experience? Praise the Lord today that He is your refuge in the midst of trials.

Friday, November 14 – Psalm 46:1-11

How does the psalmist contrast the people of God with the enemies of God in verses 4-7? How does the presence of the Lord provide stability for God's people in the midst of battle? Give thanks to the Lord for His faithful presence to His church.

Saturday, November 15 – Psalm 46:1-11

What individuals does the psalmist address in verses 8-9? Who is the Lord speaking to in verse 10? Praise the Lord today for causing spiritual warfare in your life to cease through the redemption found in Christ.
